Humane education is a comprehensive field of study that explores the connections between human rights, environmental preservation, animal protection and cultural influences. Humane education helps people to live with compassion and respect for all people, not just friends and neighbors; for all animals, not just pets; and for the earth itself, not just one's own home. It helps everyone to live an examined, intentional life so that what we do today, helps tomorrow.

Through IHE programs you learn to incorporate the inspiring, enlightening and life-altering tools of humane education into your life, your work, and the world.

When you study humane education you gain the **knowledge and tools to put your values into action** in meaningful and far-reaching ways. You learn the key elements that are at the heart of humane education, which are to:

- **cultivate reverence, respect and responsibility** for the earth, other species and all people
- **convey accurate information** so that people understand the consequences of their decisions as consumers and citizens
- **inspire creativity, curiosity and critical thinking** so that you and others can evaluate information and successfully solve problems
- **encourage informed, mindful choices** so that together we can help bring about a better world
- **use inquiry, introspection and integrity** to align your life fully with your values

Today, humane education is being incorporated into classrooms, workplaces, communities and lives around the world because of the Institute for Humane Education (IHE).

IHE Programs

Education, Community & Action

At the heart of IHE are programs that provide the tools and resources to turn humane education into action, from online resources to single workshops and week-long institutes to 4–8 week-long online courses and certificates, to a premiere two-year graduate program. No matter where you live, what level of interest you have or the experience you bring, there is a place at IHE for you to connect and learn.

Online Courses

If you haven't taken an online course before, be prepared for a dynamic learning experience that in itself is changing the face of education. Many things are possible online that are not available in traditional classroom settings. IHE's online format allows our classes to be innovative and interactive in the use of communications technology, enables people across the globe to participate, keeps our programs affordable, provides a flexible learning environment, and quickly builds a powerful, cohesive community of learners. Most courses run for either 4 or 6 weeks.

About the Graduate Programs

IHE's premiere program to study graduate level Humane Education is offered through a partnership with the highly-respected and accredited graduate school of Valparaiso University (www.valpo.edu). It is the only graduate program of its kind in comprehensive Humane Education. It includes both degree and certificate programs and is offered in an online format which allows students from the United States and abroad to complete the program remotely, with the exception of a one-week residency held at the IHE campus in Surry, Maine (required for two of the programs).

Five Distinct Programs

- 1 **Master of Education (M.Ed.)** in Humane Education (33 credits)
- 2 **Master of Arts (M.A.)** in Humane Education (33 credits)
- 3 **Concentration** in Humane Education for the M.Ed. in **Instructional Leadership** (15 credits)
- 4 **Concentration** in Humane Education for the **MALS** degree (15 credits)
- 5 **Credit-bearing Graduate Certificate** in Humane Education (either stand-alone or added to an existing degree) (15 credits)

Humane Education Core Courses are essential to all programs and include: Introduction to Humane Education, Environmental Ethics, Animal Protection, Human Rights, Culture and Change.

A One-Week Residency is required for the M.Ed. and M.A programs. It takes place at IHE's beautiful campus, on 28 oceanfront acres overlooking the mountains of Acadia National Park. The grounds include an organic garden, a beautiful wooded trail, and a pebble beach where seals, eagles, loons and osprey are frequently seen. This hands-on experience is a very popular part of the program.

A Master's Thesis is also part of the M.Ed. and M.A. programs. It represents not only the culmination of the student's studies, but also a creative contribution to the field of humane education. The topic must be professionally and socially relevant, challenging, and appropriate for the student's vision. In the project the student demonstrates the ability to integrate theory, research skills, academic course work, professional experience and goals.



Faculty

The primary faculty in the Humane Education graduate programs are leaders and pioneers in humane education, having inspired thousands of students throughout their careers. Consistent in their reviews, IHE students are glowing about the quality of the education and the attentiveness by the faculty to their individual needs as top reasons to attend IHE.

Workshops

Summer Institute

IHE offers a one-week summer program for educators to enrich their minds with and open their hearts to new ideas while reconnecting with the most fundamental reasons for why they chose to teach. Educators explore their passion for teaching as a means of confronting pressing global challenges and learn to bring issues of social justice, environmental preservation, human rights and animal protection into their classrooms, programs and communities in ways that add even greater depth and relevancy to their work. They meet and practice new skills with other educators who share the same passion for inspiring people into action.

Humane Education Terminology

MOGO, short for "most good", is a quick way of thinking about the fundamental question that underlies humane education: How can each of us, through our daily choices, our acts of citizenship, our communities, our work, and our volunteerism do the most good and the least harm to ourselves, other people, other species, and the environment? The MOGO principle invites learners of all ages to inquire, introspect, and lead lives of integrity based on their knowledge and their values.

A solutionary is someone who identifies inhumane, unsustainable, and exploitative systems and then develops practical, effective, and visionary solutions, both large and small, to replace them with those that are restorative, healthy, and just. Solutionaries bring their knowledge and skills to bear on pressing and entrenched challenges in an effort to create positive changes for all people, animals and the earth.
