At Cambridge College, you pay for your courses when you register for them. Tuition cost is currently \$405 per credit hour and there are 32 credit hours that comprise the program. There is a one-time administrative fee of \$500 payable to Cambridge College at the time of matriculation. Therefore, total tuition due at matriculation is \$2,930. At the end of the program, there is a \$110 graduation fee payable to Cambridge College. Total tuition for the program is \$13,570.

The Internship I: Residency will be held in Surry, Maine at the Institute for Humane Education only during summer semester. Students are responsible for paying for lodging, travel and meal expenses to attend Residency.

We estimate the total cost of purchasing books for the whole program, along with the cost of borrowing video/DVDs, to be \$750. This is based on purchasing new books at current list prices. If you purchase used books, it may be less.
